Dear Sir

Further to your letter dated 01 August 2005.

I wish to formally inform you that I allege the Ministry of Economic Development and your office accordingly have breached a statutory contract.

All my applications were accorded a priority application right in one form or another under the acts thus binding the Crown until those applications were decided upon subject to the statutory provisions.

All my applications were refused on the basis that the Crown considered the minerals were vested to other private concerns while I retained application rights.

I have previously alleged the Ngai Tahu (Pounamu Vesting) Act 1997 specifically made provision to protect applications and privileges pursuant to the Crown Minerals Act, yet the Crown allegedly has ignored this.

I will now lodge a complaint to the Commerce Commission in this respect and given the importance and timeframe involved, I will write to the Minister of Justice accordingly.

I was hoping to sort matters out directly with you but you have refused to change your stance on my claims ~~including~~ your refusal to allow me a Judicial Review on all matters.

For your ~~info~~ information, I include a copy of an invoice relating to survey costs etc as only part of my statutory costs on such a vast area of land as in PLA 31 02583.

I have also sent a copy of this letter to Hon. Damien O' Connor for his information.
